I, Andrew Crisp, Emergency Management Commissioner, say as follows:

- 1. I make this statement in my capacity as Emergency Management Commissioner in response to:
  - a. the questions asked of me by the Board of Inquiry into the COVID-19 Hotel Quarantine Program
     (the *Board*) in the letter from the Board dated 2 August 2020; and
  - b. in response to a Notice to Produce dated 2 August 2020 and numbered NTP-034.
- 2. This statement is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
- I have been asked to describe the responsibilities and key accountabilities, and names and usual Departments or organisations, of the persons who fulfilled the roles listed in Annexure 1 of the list of questions asked of me by the Board. Subject to the matters set out below, I have provided this information in the table at Annexure A to this statement.
- 4. Some of the roles listed in Annexure 1 of the list of questions are part of the Department of Health and Human Services' (the control agency) chain of command (namely, the State Health Coordinator, Public Health Commander, Deputy Public Health Commander(s), Department of Health and Human Services Agency Commander, COVID-19 Enforcement and Compliance Commander, COVID-19 Operation Soteria Commander, COVID-19 Accommodation Commander, Deputy Commander Detention Hotels (and their Operations Team Leader(s) and Team Leader(s)) and Deputy Commander Welfare (and their Operations Team Leader(s) and Team Leader(s))). The Department of Health and Human Services is best placed to provide the information sought with respect to these roles.
- The role of Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions Agency Commander reflects the allocation of responsibility to that department by the Department of Premier and Cabinet for the sourcing of

appropriate accommodation contracts (including food, concierge and security) to support mandatory passenger isolation and providing ongoing support to passengers for these needs. The Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions Agency Commander is best placed to provide the information sought with respect to this role.

6. The Department of Premier and Cabinet and Department of Transport are support agencies to the control agency, and those departments are best placed to provide the information sought with respect to their representatives' roles.
